With this knowledge, the boys began the long season of defeat. They stayed cheerful but stoic throughout the season because they knew they were getting better with each loss. One night they played a team full of 12-year olds that was coached by a particularly nasty individual named Marvin something-or-other (his last name escapes me). Marvin not only coached but sponsored his team. He was a bully and a thoroughly unpleasant fellow whom nobody liked. What he lacked in social graces, he made up for with his total disregard for sportsmanship.
