Clyde Dale Boyette, Jr., 64, of Perryville, Arkansas, went home to be with the Lord on January 31, 2026. He was born on October 26, 1961, in Little Rock, Arkansas, the beloved son of the late Clyde “Dale” Boyette and Karen Boyette.

A man whose faith defined his adult life, Clyde was a devoted follower of Christ, a member of Harmony Baptist Church, and a true servant of God. Those who knew him would say that wherever Clyde was, church was happening. With a guitar in his hands and a song on his heart, he shared the gospel through music, prayer, and testimony, touching countless lives along the way.

Clyde worked for many years with Otis and Dover Elevator Companies as an elevator installer. Later in life, he was ordained as a Minister and devoted himself to Evangelism. He was known as a man who never met a stranger. His smile would light up a room, and his heart reflected his deep love for people and for the Lord.

He is survived by his brothers, Anthony Boyette and Derik Boyette (Christie) of Perryville; his sister, Susan Boyette Greene of Little Rock; and many nieces, nephews, and friends who were like family. He was preceded in death by his parents and his son, Dillon Boyette.

“ *In Loving Memory of My Brother in Christ, Clyde*

To my dear friend and brother, Clyde, it's hard to believe how far we've come. Our journey started ages ago when I was just a kid letting you borrow my Tesla Five Man Acoustical Jam tape—which I never did get back, lol! Even with sixteen years between us, I spent so much time playing with Nathan, Jarrad, and Dylan, camping out in the front yard by Perryville Elementary and sneaking into your room to play with that Conan sword.

Back in the 90s, you were always in my ear talking to me about Jesus. I'll be honest, you got on my nerves at the time, but after I started changing my ways, I found you once again. We spent so many hours on the phone after that; we really should've gotten frequent flyer miles or some kind of perks for all that talk.

I'll never forget the time we went to the VA laying hands and pray for those who requested it. After spending time with a dying man, we finally got cornered by the police. When they told us we had to leave, you asked one of the officers if he was a Christian. When he said yeah, you broke out that big old smile and told him you'd rather have a Christian take you to jail than anyone else, acting as if it would've been an honor! Once we got away from that, we moved down to War Memorial Park, running through there like a couple of kids handing out tracts for Jesus. We were trying to “save the world” with good intentions, even in the rough places like those near the tire shops off Asher Avenue where it didn't seem safe to go. Even your dad and my dad shared the same concern for us because of the places we stepped.

Looking back, it's easy to see that our faith wasn't without works; therefore, it was alive and well, just like Jesus. You were the one who baptized me in the creek behind Harmony Church, and I'll never forget you singing that song on the guitar. You were also the first person to ever introduce me to your technique of mustard-battered deer tenderloin. We frequented many a church and many a

revival together. Whatever perceptions or projected thoughts others had about us just rolled off our backs like water on a duck; we both knew the voice of the enemy is as chewed up as a termite in a wooden yo-yo.

I'd bet a dollar against a donut you're smiling down on this right now. I love you, and I love the Lord, and you had a massive hand in my pilgrimage. I can never forget that "JESUS" sign every time I drive by it. It's hard to believe that sign is still holding up, considering it was just pressed plywood hanging on that pine tree for the whole world to see all these years. It stands as a testament to everything we believed in. I even noticed you had a sticker that same color on the back of your car—matching the color of the sign we put up over thirteen years ago—the last time I saw you at Walmart in your cowboy hat. You didn't see me when I saw you, but I saw that same light you always carried.

In the words of Jesus... "Well done, good and faithful."

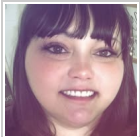

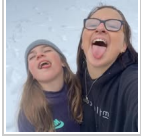

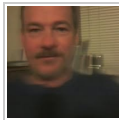
