David Carter Adams, 32, of Houston, Texas, formerly of Perryville, Arkansas and Austin, Texas, died on Wednesday, July 16 in Houston. He was born February 13, 1976.

David was preceded in death by his grandfathers Harvel Carter Adams of Stuttgart, Arkansas, and William Paul Van Dalsem of Perryville, Arkansas. Survivors include his wife Ashley Rodgers Adams; mother Carol Van Dalsem Adams Allen of Perryville, Arkansas; father George Rowland Adams of Stuttgart, Arkansas; brother Nathan Adams and his wife Kate of Tampa, Florida; grandmothers Royce Irene Van Dalsem of Perryville, Arkansas, and Mary Elizabeth Adams of Stuttgart, Arkansas; nieces Sara Katherine and Abigail Elizabeth Adams of Tampa, Florida; and many other extended family members and friends.

David is a 1994 graduate of Perryville High School and a 1999 graduate of the University of Arkansas at Fayetteville where he was a member of Sigma Nu fraternity. He was a senior vice-president of equity research with Jefferies and Company, Inc. in Houston. David volunteered with the Groceries To Go program for the needy in Austin. He was an avid outdoorsman and enjoyed many hunting and fishing trips with his friends and family. He was a member of Perryville United Methodist Church.

The funeral service will be held at 2:00 p.m. on Saturday, July 19 at Perryville United Methodist Church in Perryville, Arkansas. Visitation will be held at the church from 1:00 - 2:00 p.m. prior to the service. A memorial service will also

be held in Austin, Texas at 11:00 a.m. on Monday, July 21, at First United Methodist Church.

We were no longer boys, we were men with guns and trucks and keys to shops with power tools and tractors. Okay, we were still boys, we just didn't know it and didn't want to hear it if you told us. We were too young to understand how much we didn't know. Blissful in our ignorance of what life would be and what time would bring.

Then college. I saw David once or twice after that. We all went to the movies once. I saw him at Christmas a few times. Life got busy and took me away from life in Perryville. David was no longer that sandy haired little boy, standing on the edge of our mischief, he was a man making his way in the world and leaving the same impression

on everyone he met. When you met him, you knew he was an investor. Not an investor as in a job, you knew he was an investor because he invested something into the lives of everyone he met. He invested time, friendship and love. He invested something good and that is his legacy. Im proud of what he invested in me. We dont understand why things happen like they do, but we know that David has his reward. All of those investments in lives here on earth have paid him dividends for him in heaven.

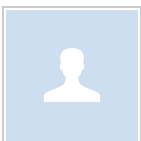

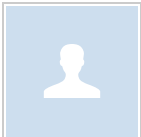
