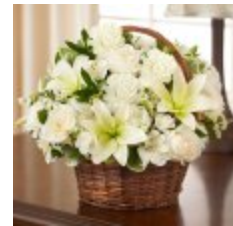

I believe she was telling me goodbye in her own way. I will cherish that call for the rest of my life! I would like to extend my condolences to all the family. It is a hard thing to give up a mother.
