Edward W. Doss, of Morrilton, beloved husband of Gene Doss, passed away on July 11, 2010, at home in Morrilton. He was a wonderful husband, brother, father, uncle and grandfather and great-grandfather and will be sorely missed by family and friends. Ed is predeceased by his loving wife of 64 years, Gene Doss, and his brothers: Dr. Alfred Doss, and Dr. Alan Doss. Ed is survived by his sister and her husband, Neta and Glen Smith of Hopkinsville, Kentucky. He is also survived by his daughter, Norma Doss Nickerson, of Micanopy, Florida and son, Edward W. Doss, Jr., of Malvern, Arkansas. Also cherishing his memory are his grandchildren: Genie (Nickerson) Dana, James Nickerson, Jon Nickerson, Michele (Doss) Easter, Stephanie Doss, and Thomas Doss.
