Floyd Fillmore “Fill” Neeley, III, age 68 of Morrilton, Arkansas, passed away on Monday, October 27, 2025. 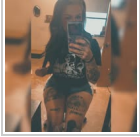

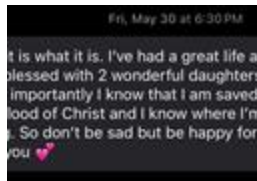
