George Terrell Wade II, of Little Rock, AR passed away unexpectedly on or about Monday, May 26th, 2025 at the age of 65. He was born in Macon, GA on February 1st, 1960 along with a twin brother who tragically only lived for one day. He was named after his paternal grandfather.

His family moved to Arkansas in 1965 where he grew up and graduated from Morrilton High School in 1978. He excelled in basketball and was named an all-state player. He briefly played basketball at Central Baptist College and finished his business degree at the University of Central Arkansas. Terrell was intelligent, had a love for music, and was even known to write his own lyrics. He also enjoyed writing poetry, often reflecting on his life experiences.

His proudest achievement was his son, Grayson George Wade born November 3, 2002. In recent years, they grew exceptionally close as his son became the man he was incredibly proud of. They had just spent a very special week together shortly before his passing.

He was preceded in death by his mother, Barbara Wade, and his father George Wade. His survivors include his son, Grayson Wade, from Indianapolis; an older sister, Kim Kreider, from San Antonio; and a younger sister, Lauren Wade, from Conway. He is also survived by his ex-wife Tina Richardson with whom he remained friends.
