“Greg was my best friend for thirty-six years. The adventures we had together over that course of time would fill several action-packed books. During the early 80s, we adventured in the jungles of Honduras together in search of the lost white city. We scuba dived one hundred feet below the glimmering surface of the Caribbean. I moved out to Salt Lake City in the year 2000 to be near him. He taught us how to hike up the Wasatch mountain canyons in the middle of the night during winter. We brought light sticks to put in the snow as markers so we could sled all the way back down. He was a fearless adventurer who would venture into dark places few had the nerve to follow. We crawled into many caves over the course of our lives. Eden's Falls cave in the Ozarks and Nutty Putty cave in Utah, to name just two. We collaborated on a superhero comic called *The Grub Bros*, based after ourselves. Together with three other teammates at Joe T. Robinson High school, we entered the Olympics of the Mind competition and took our team all the way to win the World Championship. Greg got me into the SCA where we fought side by side in many battles throughout the mid to late 80s. There he forged many strong bonds with SCA fighters across the country. We published our own zines over the years, encouraging our friends to submit their writing and artwork. Greg Davis was a warrior of the light, and he shone the way through the darkness of this world for anyone with enough courage and stamina to follow. Our ideal dream since high school of course was to save the world. Greg had a startling ability to forge a unique friendship with each and every individual he came to know and love. He made everyone feel as if they were his best friend. I will always consider Greg to be family. The extended network of friends across the country eventually came to be known as Grubs, too. We're all one big Grub tribe. It's been a long, strange, twisted road we've all traveled together. The Grub will always remain alive in our hearts.
