He was an avid mechanic who would always fix things himself due to his background of building mud trucks, race cars and his passion for anything with an engine. From a young age he enjoyed taking his trucks out riding backroads and would drop his truck in any hole he saw, Mud riding was a passion he had up until the day he passed. He raced at I-30 speedway from 90-93. Gregory was #77 and had Bart Simpson painted on the hood of his race car. He was a volunteer firefighter for west Pulaski fire for multiple years in the late 90s to early 2000s

he had a mentality of if he wanted to learn something he had to master it. Gregory was an enthusiast of water sports and was a frequent boater, loved skiing and riding jet skis. He acquired a 4-year certification to be a rescue diver as well as went 123 feet under lake Ouachita on top of the underwater town and got to see it with his own eyes. He liked to hunt and fish, enjoyed scuba diving and playing the slots, and was a country man through and

through who loved having a cold one in his hand, and lived a simple life.
