Pat brought her light to every life she touched, and it would be her wish for you to spread that light to the world.

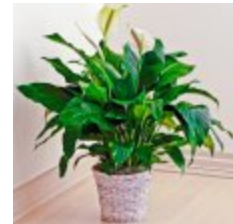
