August 8, 1944 - October 15, 2012

Rich Miller, 68, of Morrilton, Arkansas, went to be with his Lord and Savior on October 12, 2012, at 4:30 p.m. doing what he loved. Rich was on his motorcycle returning from a trip to meet a lifelong friend in Birmingham, Alabama.

Rich was born in Lansdale, Pennsylvania, on August 8, 1944. Rich attended Southwest Miami Senior High Dade County Community College, and the University of Miami. He served in the U.S. Air Force for 16 years. He was employed by Federal Aviation Administration for 35 years at Miami International Airport before retiring and moving to Morrilton with his wife. He was a member of First Baptist Church, Morrilton where he was involved in fellowship and cooking for the AWANA program. He also regularly served in the church Food Pantry.

Rich was preceded in death by his wife of 28 years, Beth Stobaugh Miller of Morrilton, Arkansas; his mother and father, Dorothy Mae and Franklin H. Miller of Newberry, Florida. He is survived by his sister and brother-in-law Jeanie and Rick Elmore of Newberry, Florida and a host of friends.

Rich will be buried Wednesday, October 24, 2012, with full military honors in Newberry, Florida. A memorial service will be held at 2:00 p.m. Saturday, October 27, at First Baptist Church in Morrilton, with Dr. Bill Brown officiating. Memorials may be made to First Baptist Church, 200 E.
