There were days of cutting wood for the stoves because winter was coming. I remember days of music around the piano with Rose playing the piano and the boys playing their guitars. If I say so myself we made some good music. Sundays my family and the Miller family would meet at church to worship God that Rose prayed to for her family to walk in the light of Jesus. She always played the piano and sang songs during the service. I can still hear her swee moving voice. Watermelon, homemade ice cream, car racing, deer camp, camping trips or trips to the swimming hole were all part of my childhood and Rose was there to make sure we had fun and behaved ourselves.
