He was a graduate of Morrilton High School, he voluntarily joined the Navy in 1942 served for 4 years and was honorably discharged as a Radioman First Class. He then went to work at First State Bank for 17 years. Next he worked for Morrilton Security Bank for 21 years and then retired as President of the bank. After retirement, he and his wife Sally traveled the country for 12 years spending much time together enjoying life. He was a member of the First Baptist Church in Morrilton.
