



## Stephen Bradley Thomas

August 18, 1949 - May 4, 2026

Stephen Bradley Thomas Sr., age 76, of Old Hickory, formerly of Plumerville, was reunited with his Lord and Savior and his beautiful wife on Monday, May 4, 2026. He was a kind and gentle grandfather, a dedicated father, a faithful husband, son, brother, and a friend to all who knew him.

Steve was born on August 18, 1949, in Morrilton, the eldest son of the late Bradley Thomas and Bobbye Ramer Thomas. He attended school in both Plumerville and Morrilton and, at age 18, enlisted in the United States Army, where he served in Vietnam, earning a Bronze Star and other decorations for his service to this country. After his service, he began his 40-year career with Green Bay Packaging at the paper mill, retiring in 2012. Steve was an avid outdoorsman who loved hunting and fishing with his son, Brad, and always looked forward to going to deer camp every year with his good friends and coworkers. Steve was a Master Mason and a long-time member of Plumerville First Baptist Church.

In addition to his parents, Steve was preceded in death by his wife of over 50 years, Sarah Leigh Thomas, his son, Stephen Bradley "Brad" Thomas II, and his brother, Phil Thomas. He leaves behind his loving son, Michael Thomas of Plumerville, and one grandson, Jack Thomas of Fayetteville, as well as his sister, Andrea Holland of Plumerville, four beloved nephews, and many friends and acquaintances who will miss him dearly.

Steve will always be remembered for his dry sense of humor and his tireless work ethic. He always worked hard for what he had and would help anyone who needed him. Steve loved nothing more than being outside in the woods and on the farm, tending the garden, and feeding the birds with his wife at their home in Old Hickory.
