“ Terry and I played a lot of football and on the bus home we would compare bruises. After one Friday night game we were checking and counting our bruises and I mentioned that I would be working cattle all day Saturday. He had never done that and said it sounded like fun. So I was very happy to have the help. The next day at 6 am we got started collecting the caves. He was a great help and very strong, my job was cut in half. We worked about 180 in the morning and took lunch. After lunch we went to another pasture where we would work another 150 caves. This is where Terry's fun and games started. We had been taking all the caves down by grabbing a hind leg and the other person grabbing a front leg. Terry said I think I can take them down by myself. I said okey let's see. He ran full speed into the side of a 400 pound calf . In a split second he was sitting on top. So I had a try, and it worked. We had already worked most of the small ones so Terry and I took turns tackling caves. We got down to the last three and one of those was a calf of at least 600 pounds. Terry knew he could and I was not so sure. The lot was almost empty so the calf could run which meant you had to get close before you started your run. Without a bit of fear he got close and then ran at the calf. He grabbed both legs and threw the calf over. They hit so hard that his momentum carried him all the way over. The calf got up and just looked around. I didn't try, if Terry couldn't do it I didn't think I could. We worked that one together. It turned out to be the best day I had working cattle.
Terry was a very special person, he never said anything about me not living with my family or when I lived in the field house. He excepted and was friends with everyone. He was big and strong but also kind and caring. I wish we had more people like Terry.
