Willa Dean Peck Denton, 91, of Hattieville, died November 23, 2018. Dean, as she was called, was born in Hattieville, December 11, 1926, a daughter of Harvey Lair Peck and Mary Etta Masingill Peck. She graduated from Wonderview High School and received Bachelor's and Master of Education degrees from Arkansas State Teachers' College. Dean taught in elementary schools in Conway County for more than 40 years before retiring.

Preceding her in death were her husband, Leo Denton; her sister, Treva Lair Meador and brother-in-law, Monte D. Meador and a niece, Monica Lair Meador.
